Alan Ayckbourn's *Confusions* is series of five interlinked one-act plays: *Mother Figure*, *Drinking Companion*, *Between Mouthfuls*, *Gosforth's Fete*, and *A Talk in the Park*. Each play is entirely different - typifying Ayckbourn's particular brand of comedy and his ability to dissect human behaviour. Each, however, deals with the common themes of loneliness and relationships. The characters and their conflicts are immediately recognisable and are still relevant today.

This is a challenging project and I have decided not to cast each play separately, but to follow Ayckbourn's original plan (well, almost!).

He chose to use only five actors – 2 female and 3 male – each taking multiple roles.

My ideal cast will be 3 females and 3 males playing ages between 30 and 60.

It won't be possible to indicate definite roles until the auditions are over, as the matching of ages is important! So auditionees must be prepared to play any part.

Because this production will be quite complex, rehearsals need to begin in mid-February (Mondays/Tuesdays and Thursdays with extra rehearsals for tech and dress)

Performances will be April 8th to 13th – with a matinee on 13th.

Scripts will be available from the box office from 10th Oct. As there are only 6 scripts, PLEASE return asap!



Hello, I'm Jeannie Roberts!

Act 1

I have been a Toads member since 1964

Act 2

In 1974 I joined the Toads Committee as secretary and 23 years later, I was still there (don't think anyone wanted the job!)

Our venue was the council owned concert hall Babbacombe theatre where we played a 32 week winter season of 10 plays from September to may so there were always 3 plays in various stages of production, performing to a theatre club of approx., 2,000 plus the general public.

After the initial 'get-in,' each play required the transportation of 'the set' furniture, props and costumes, with the whole exercise performed in reverse 10 times a season.

The 'tools of our trade' were scattered over 3 properties, Toad Hall and Toad Manor (just off the St.Marychurch precinct) which we owned, and rented storage space in St. Annes road near the theatre. On those Sunday mornings we only needed Hercules the cart horse and could have done a Steptoe and Son street performance. We looked a motley crew.

We dreamed of a headquarters encompassing rehearsal rooms, wardrobe, props, lighting, scenery and social space. A car park would be nice and the icing on the cake - a stage and auditorium.

We felt the 'writing was on the wall' as the council had intimated that their ideal tenant at Babbacombe would take the theatre all year round on a fully repairing lease. Ouch! Our hard-earned pennies being spent on someone else's leaky premises? We thought not! So, armed with the appropriate 'go ahead' from the Toads members, the search was on for a place to call home

Act 3

The redundant church of St Marks, not the first door we had opened in our quest, but could it be the last?

As the heavy arched wooden doors creaked open the present tenants swooped down, their wings disturbing the dust laden air made visible by the shafts of sunlight forcing their way through a long-neglected roof. Surely a setting for 'Murder in the Cathedral'.

The gloom revealed the still visible imprint of knees on hassocks, now reduced to provide bedding for the rodent squatters! Ghostly pews, chewing gum in the choir stalls hurriedly disposed of before the final hymn rang out, hymn books still laying open. We wouldn't have been at all surprised to see 'Pyewacket the cat' - from John van Druten's 'Bell Book and Candle' - stroll by.

Ticking a lot of 'our boxes' we had the purchase price £25,000 but would the redundant church commissioners accept the Toads as fitting owners and if so, could we raise the funds to artistically convert this grand but lonely building?

Act 4

Once again Toads members gave us the mandate to pursue the dream and we embarked on our 'long day's journey into night' to make it into reality.

Act 5 and final act

The toads wheeled me out for the 20th anniversary and I'm back for a repeat performance for the 40th. The Lord knows what they are going to do for the 50th as I shall probably be in that great auditorium in the sky, with my incredible husband Lionel and all those talented Toads actors who so generously shared their theatrical knowledge with an eager 24 year old tadpole.
